About Us: 100% volunteer-run.

We are a volunteer-run heritage railway set within the stunning Blaenavon World Heritage Site on the edge of the Brecon Beacons National Park.

Founded in 1983 by enthusiasts who wanted to preserve the Brynmawr to Pontypool line for future generations, since then we've grown and developed to welcome thousands of passengers every year!

Today our volunteers operate steam and heritage diesel services on weekends and bank holidays throughout the spring and summer, allowing visitors to take a trip back in time through the heritage landscape!

We also operate on selected Wednesdays during the school summer holidays and have an exciting year-round programme of special events, including our popular Halloween Ghost Trains and Christmas Steam Santa Specials.

Our timetable of services and special events is available to view on our website and from our station shop or ticket office.

FIND US:

Our main station at Furnace Sidings, located close to the A465 Heads of the Valleys Road, has ample free car and coach parking, together with refreshment, toilet, and gift-shopping facilities. We are just off the B4248 at Garn-yr-Erw between Brynmawr and Blaenavon. Please use postcode NP4 9SF for satnavs and mobile devices. Continue heading down this road until you reach the station.







What to see:

Travel through the beautiful landscape behind our steam or heritage diesel locomotives.

Savour the atmosphere on board our lovingly restored carriages, including the vintage train on selected running days.

At Furnace Sidings enjoy a wide selection of refreshments in the Fireman's shovel tea room and buy that practical souvenir or gift from Eric's Emporium.

Alight at one of our stations to visit one of the nearby attractions, including the Big Pit National Coal Museum and World Heritage Centre.

Alight at Whistle Inn Halt and partake of liquid refreshments or food at the Whistle Inn.

Go for a walk alongside the track on the Pontypool to Blaenavon Cycle Route.

The Journey:

Our railway and its four stations are the ideal way to explore the stunning UNESCO-listed World Heritage landscape in style!

A round trip on the railway lasts approximately one hour, and on standard running days, we typically operate to the following service pattern:

Trains first head south, starting from Furnace Sidings and travelling along a short branch line to serve Big Pit Halt. Situated next to the Big Pit National Coal Museum, the station is always popular with those combining their trip with a visit to the museum!

Trains then head north from Big Pit, back through Furnace Sidings towards Whistle Inn Halt. Here passengers can visit the adjacent Whistle Inn public house, or explore the Garn Lakes, which have been beautifully reclaimed from their mining past.

Leaving Whistle Inn Halt your train then heads south again along the former mainline towards Blaenavon.

After passing through Blaenavon High Level station, the train reaches the current end of line at Coed Avon. Although passengers cannot alight here, you will return the short distance to Blaenavon High Level. Located above Blaenavon town centre with its many attractions and local businesses, the station makes an ideal place to alight – though please be aware that some may find the climb back up slightly challenging. Here the locomotive will run around, before returning to Furnace Sidings, where the train will terminate. With the crew and engine working extremely hard up some of the steepest gradients in the country, this part of the journey is always popular with passengers!

Your ticket is valid all day and we strongly advise that you make a day of your visit by combining a trip on the railway with a visit to another attraction in the area.

With the exception of The Railway Shop, all other attractions across Blaenavon are owned and operated independently of Blaenavon's Heritage Railway. During certain special events and on selected running days, our services may also be altered to meet operational requirements and ensure visitor safety. Trains may not serve all stations, and tickets may have validity restrictions. Please check the timetable and fare information in advance of your visit.

TRAVEL IN STYLE ABOARD OUR SALOON VEHICLES

Starting in 2022 customers will have the opportunity to travel in our two superbly restored engineers' saloon vehicles. Built by the Great Western Railway in 1910 and 1948 respectively, they add a new stylish experience.

On regular running days dedicated First Class tickets will be available to purchase, being valid for one round trip aboard the saloon in service on the day from Furnace Sidings station.

Great Western Railway ENGINEER'S SALOON 6479 – 1910

Our resident Engineer's Saloon. Built by the Great Western Railway in 1910 using the frames of an even older former Manchester and Milford Railway carriage, its operating life was spent transporting engineering directors around the Gloucester district area, including Newport.

It has recently undergone a refurbishment and re-entered regular service in late 2021. Freshly painted in resplendent British Railways' 'Crimson Lake and Cream' livery with an interior featuring both settee and directors' table seating, the carriage is particularly suited for larger parties and for those wanting to experience the life of those engineers who were in charge of looking after the line!

Great Western Railway HAWKSWORTH INSPECTION SALOON

In March 2022 we welcomed 1948-built Great Western Railway Hawksworth Inspection Saloon W80976W on an initial three-year hire period from the West Somerset Railway.

Superbly restored, the carriage entered service on our railway in 2022. Painted in Great Western Railway colours and boasting an especially luxurious interior, the carriage is particularly well suited to those wanting to add style to their visit.

We're keeping a welcome on the hillside for you at the Fireman's Shovel refreshment room. Sit inside and savour the vintage atmosphere, or enjoy your refreshments amidst stunning scenery on the platform.

We stock a variety of treats and snacks, including a wide range of hot and cold drinks, through to ice cream. Vegan, dairy-free and gluten-free options are available. The tearoom is open on service days only. If you have any other specific dietary requirements or want anything altered in your order, please let us know. Much of our food is made fresh to order and we can often be flexible. Our volunteers politely request that visitors pay by bank card or contactless wherever possible.



Our little on-site shop is named after and dedicated to long-serving volunteer Eric Edwards. We also have our own **model railway club** that meets Tuesdays between 11am and 3pm and Fridays between 7pm and 9.30pm.


